**January Meeting.** Anne Reynolds demonstrated flowers using hearty clay. This is an airdrying clay which is safe to use on cakes and is much more robust if people want to keep the flowers or model which has been made to celebrate a special occasion. Anne explained how to colour the white clay with dust colours. The coloured clay can be used to colour the white clay, they are very intense so a little goes a long way. Anne made some red roses, ferns and gypsophila.

**February Meeting.** We have Alison Henderson demonstrating a cup and saucer. Alison has been to see us before when she did the baby shoes, so we are looking forward to seeing her again as she was a very good demonstrator.
